POTTSGROVE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS HOST NIGHT HIKE AT ALTHOUSE ARBORETUM



Many fall festivals play up the fright factor. How refreshing that here in Upper Pottsgrove, students from the high school decided to create a festival that played up the fun factor instead. While the Night Hike (held on Friday,

October 17th at the Althouse Arboretum on Gilbertsville Road) retained a hint of spooky excitement, the focus was family-friendly, the event was geared toward young children, and the “theme” was to simply learn about nocturnal nature.

The Night Hike was conceived, organized and hosted by Pottsgrove High School’s “Spark the Wave” Club under the leadership of seniors Chloe Klaus, Andrew Heuer, Brianna Costira and Danielle Buchanan. Spark the Wave is a club started four years ago by students interested in growing their own community service, and those of us who are familiar with their past two Winter Fests know that these kids can really pull together an event.

Over 350 people attended the Night Hike, where participants were welcome to hike the lower-level trails of the arboretum under a dark sky and search for hidden items on a scavenger list. The trails were artfully lit by glow sticks, producing a mesmerizing experience. Along with Spark the Wave, students from the High School Environmental Club (the POWER Rangers) and National Honor Society volunteered their time to paint kids’ faces, lead them in crafts such as pumpkin painting and leaf art, tell Native American stories about nocturnal animals, and hand out homemade snacks. Marshmallows were abundant and two carefully controlled campfires surrounded by stump benches were available for all. The entire event was free to the public. CMD employees Jenn Ridgeway and Valorie Robinson, were kind enough to donate their time to bus people from Hillside Aquatic Club parking lot, which Upper Pottsgrove Township made available to the Arboretum. Snacks were made by the students. Even the pumpkins were donated.

FOLIAGE & FERTILIZER

BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES GUIDE TO PREP FOR FALL

FALL IS FOR SEEDING, FERTILIZING, AND MANAGING LEAVES

The Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy would like to remind you of the importance of preventing stormwater pollution while you make the most of the fall season. Stormwater is formed when rainwater makes its way into storm drains or runs off our properties directly into streams picking up harmful substances that pollute our waterways. This autumn we need your help to control stormwater pollution that is unique to the season while preparing your lawns for the weather ahead. Here are some tips to help you protect your plants, trees, and streams.

TIPS

- 1** Dispose of leaf litter and yard waste in a compost pile and never in the street or stream. Shred waste to use as mulch or fertilizer. Look for yard waste collection opportunity in your municipality.
- 2** Do not use fertilizers immediately before a rainstorm and do not apply them in excess. Always follow the directions on the bottle for application and disposal. Excess fertilizer can not be absorbed by the soil and will wash away with the rain.
- 3** Protect young trees on your property by covering trunks with ventilated tree tubes or tree guards. Young trees are particularly vulnerable to grazing and deer rub so protecting the trunks will improve their survival.
- 4** Prune your summer perennials in your rain garden, bioswale, or garden. After the first frost cut back dry stems of perennials to soil level. This will extend the life of your plants, improve the health your garden, and showcase winter perennials.



MAKING LEAF MOLD

ALTERNATIVE TO BAGGING YOUR LEAVES

This fall season consider making leaf mold while raking up leaves on your property. Leaf mold, unlike compost, is partially decomposed leaves that act as a nutrient rich substance. Leaf mold helps to improve the soil texture, aeration, and fertility.

Making leaf mold is a simple process. Collect leaves in an enclosed space that can be made from chicken wire, snow fencing, or another material that allows air to circulate. Let the leaves decompose over the winter. To speed up the process shred the leaves before placing them in the enclosure.


Important Information About Your Volunteer Fire Company

Upper Pottsgrove Township is served by one all volunteer fire company. The firehouse, apparatus and all equipment are owned by the fire companies. Upper Pottsgrove Township provides a portion of their operating budgets. However, a great portion of the funding needed to operate and maintain them comes from community donations or is raised at events such as flower sales or bake sales by their men and

Fire company members provide the only municipal service that is run with volunteer labor. No one from the fire company receives any compensation for the time spent serving the residents and businesses of Upper Pottsgrove Township.

In addition to responding to fires, the volunteers respond to rescues of all types, environmental hazards, and other threats to life or property in Upper Pottsgrove Township. Fire prevention education to the schools, residents and businesses is also taught by members.

The company strives to provide the resources needed for their volunteers to stay current with the latest techniques for handling emergency calls, stressing safety at all times while responding 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.


