To report dead deer on N. Charlotte Street, Gilbertsville Road, Magers Mill Road & Route 100, call PennDOT at (610) 275-2368 & "Press 0". The contractor for PennDOT has 48-60 hours to pick up the dead deer after it is reported.

To report dead deer on remaining streets, call the PA Game Commission at (610) 926-1966.
