Is It Time to Retire your American Flag?

The Upper Pottsgrove Township Administration Building, 1409 Farmington Avenue, will once again be a collection center for tattered and soiled American Flags of any size from April 15th until Friday, May 29th during normal business hours. These Flags will then be delivered to the



Viet Nam Veteran's Memorial, on the island in Pottstown's Memorial Park where the Veterans and Boy Scouts will retire the Flags at a very impressive and patriotic ceremony on Sunday, June 7th-starting at 1 PM. The public is encouraged to attend and participate, especially the school-aged members of our community. Bring your cameras & favorite lawn chair.

From the Historical Committee Files

This past summer while installing plaques on historical homes, we discovered a small, seemingly old, steel-fenced and well-manicured Jewish cemetery in the 1100 block of State Road. Area residents and our office staff could not shed any light on its origins and little was known, except that . . . "someone always came and cut the grass." This called for further investigation since there were no signs or other postings. The only thing evident was that all of the tombstones bore the Star of David on them owing to their origins. But we wanted to learn more.

An e-mail to the Congregation Mercy and Truth on North Keim Street led us to Jack Wolf, Esq., former president of the Pottstown Borough Council. Mr. Wolf was very accommodating in sharing his knowledge about the plot which has a fascinating history right here in our community. The name of the cemetery is Congregation Hahawas Achem which translates from the Hebrew as "Brotherly Love." According to the history of Montgomery County, the cemetery is the oldest Jewish institution in the county, with the first burials around 1890. In the middle 1920's the Congregation Hahawas Achem was reconstituted as a cemetery company.

This was accomplished by Benjamin Wolf, Esq. (uncle to Jack Wolf). At that time Adolf Wolf (Jack's grandfather) was elected President. When he was no longer able to carry on this task, it was continued by Benjamin and then, Harold Wolf (Jack's father). When he passed away in 1996, Jack took over the duties. For 88 years this has been a family affair.

Jack goes on to say that the Congregation is quite unusual from the perspective of Jewish history in that membership included Jews who arrived in Pottstown in the 1860's and

the Eastern European Jews that came here in the mid-1880's. The German families included the Weitzenkorns, Millers (S. Miller & Son Men's Shop), and the Mosheim's, who also ran a men's shop at 207 High Street. The descendants of these families still reside in the area; but only the Weitzenkorn's retain their Jewish identity.

The Eastern European families included the Wolf's, the Weiss's (Atty. Alvin Weiss), the Estreicher's and others. There is still a small membership who pays dues and several families who pay an annual maintenance fee.

An interesting sidebar to this story: The congregation's synagogue that is now situated on North Keim Street was originally located at High and Warren Streets in Pottstown from 1920 until the 1960's when it was razed.

It is brief stories (like this) about our Culture, Community's History, Businesses, Homes and Families that **Upper Pottsgrove's Historical Board** wants our friends to submit to the Township Office for archival safe-keeping. We also need volunteers who wish to donate some time in researching information to this effort. Again, contact the Township Office of your availability. Please don't let our township's rich legacy die with the generations that created it for all of us. If you enjoy genealogy or just have an investigator in you wanting to break out, we need your help! High Schoolers, you can sit, record (and learn first hand) the recollections of older citizens about the history of our community (and maybe even gain extra credit at school as part of a special project—talk to your teachers). And then submit your efforts to the Township to become part of a compendium. Let this become part of your legacy!
