National Preparedness Month is Observed

The month of September is National Preparedness Month. It is a time that we ALL as individuals should focus on OUR



personal responsibilities to **Be Ready** for any emergency. Upper Pottsgrove Township joins a national coalition of likeminded, disaster-preparedness communities to keep its residents informed and will issue an official Proclamation at the August General Meeting. Fact sheets and brochures, including Activity Books aimed at children from ages 4-7 & 8-11, will be available at the Township offices while supplies last during the month. Please stop in.

The first place we need to be prepared is in our home. One of the first things we need to do is determine our potential threats. These will vary depending on where we live locally: hurricanes, high winds and snow, plus occasional tornadoes and extended power outages. Each family needs to know what the common threats are in their area and to a certain extent determine their preparedness actions in response to them.

On a general level, families need to take the steps we advise all to take. Considering that first responders may not be able to get to your home for at least 72 hours and that utility services may be down for many days, we need to provide ourselves with the means to survive. Have a pantry well stocked with canned goods and other easily prepared foods. Having an adequate supply of drinking water is vital. Prescription meds should be kept current. A first aid kit to treat injuries, a battery operated radio and, of course, several flash lights should be kept on hand. Be sure to check the batteries in your flash lights periodically to make sure they are working. Better yet, remove those batteries until needed to avoid leakage damage. Use Ziplock® bags. An additional precaution might be to keep extra bottles of propane available so that you can cook on the grill (outside) should the need arise.

In some disasters, you may not be at home but caught away at



work. For that reason it is a good idea to keep an emergency kit at your office or in the car with a change of clothes, a radio and, most importantly, a plan of where your family will gather in case of an emergency evacuation. Speaking of potential evacuations, it is imperative that a plan be developed for the family so that everyone's location is known and, if necessary or desirable, a pre-planned meeting place defined and known by everyone. Remember that phones, particularly cell phones, will usually be inoperative during these stressed periods.

For just such a possibility, always try to keep a half full tank of gas in the car so that you can evacuate in case of an emergency. An emergency travel kit should also be pre-assembled for use in an evacuation situation and it would be wise to conduct training exercises.

The real key to successful citizen preparedness is to keep it relevant and simple. That is why the *Ready* program is so important. To further help individuals to prepare themselves for emergency situations, go to: http://www.ready.gov/america. In the end, we are relying on people to be self-reliant, particularly in those disasters which overwhelm local emergency personnel and can delay assistance to you for 72 to 96 hours.

Leaves and Grass Clippings

Remember, by ordinance, the blowing or sweeping of leaves and grass clippings into streets or gutters is prohibited, as they block storm water drains and ditches, promote growth along curbs and can create hazardous driving conditions.



Upper Pottsgrove Resources

In times of emergency, it is important to know what resources are available to a community. It is also important to realize that your municipality does not have an unending supply of common resources that are necessary during times of emergency. These resources can range from all terrain vehicles to portable generators, but could also include chainsaws and four wheel drive vehicles. To properly prepare ourselves, it is wise to have a list of these available resources on hand that you as a citizen might have and be willing to share in a time of crisis.

If you have any of this equipment available and would be willing to offer it in times of emergency, please take the time to provide a list of the resources with your contact information to the Upper Pottsgrove Township Office. Additionally, you can also register for Montgomery County's ReadyNotify emergency text alerting system at montco.alertpa.org. During the registration process, you will be asked to provide information concerning available resources.


