MESSAGE FROM YOUR TAX COLLECTOR

Good news – there will be no increase in taxes for County, Township and Fire taxes for 2013. Please note that if you did not pay your real estate or per capita taxes on or before December 31, 2012, your taxes are now considered delinquent and have been turned over to another agency for collection. You can expect to receive a notice on or about February 15, 2013 from the agency handling collection of your delinquent taxes. Northeast Revenue Service will handle the collection of delinquent County, Township and Fire taxes, Portnoff Law Associates will handle the collection of delinquent School taxes, and Berkheimer Associates will handle the collection of delinquent per capita taxes. If you need information for any of these agencies, please contact my office at (610) 323-8675, ext. 203.

You can expect to receive your 2013 County, Township and Fire tax bill on or about the first week in February, 2013. If you do not receive a bill, please contact my office immediately. Please note that tax hours will be listed on your tax bill. If you wish to pay your taxes in person, and the listed hours are not convenient, please contact my office to set up an appointment. Otherwise, you can mail your tax payment to P.O. Box 3095, Stowe, PA 19464, or place it in the drop box located at the Township administrative offices (please do not leave cash), 1409 Farmington Avenue, during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm). If you require a receipt, please include both copies of the bill and a self-addressed stamped envelope. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to give me a call. Thank you.

The Montgomery County Department of Public Safety asks that anyone who calls 9-1-1 from a cellular phone in communities near the County border immediately state that "I'm calling from Montgomery County" when the call-taker answers the phone.

If the nearest cell tower to where the call is placed is across the border in a neighboring county, the call will be routed to the 9-I-I centers in Philadelphia, Bucks, Berks, Chester or Delaware counties, depending on where the tower is located. The neighboring 9-I-I centers will transfer the call to Montgomery County, but the time it takes to figure the actual loca-

gomery County, but the time it takes to figure the actual location out, transfer the call and then supply the information about the incident again could make a difference in saving someone's life.

Stating "I'm calling from Montgomery County" at the outset will greatly reduce any delay in getting people the help they need

Using a landline to call 9-1-1 will result in the call automatically being routed to the proper call center.


Trash pick-up is every Wednesday. If you see litter in the vicinity of your property, please pick it up and dispose of it properly.



CLEARING SNOW FROM DRIVEWAYS

INSTRUCTIONS FOR HELPING TO KEEP YOUR **DRIVEWAY CLEAR OF SNOW AFTER** THE **TOWNSHIP PLOWS HAVE PASSED**

- 1) Facing the street, clear an area to the left of your driveway.
- 2) As a result, all of the snow that you clear should be placed to the right of your driveway.
- 3) This cleared area will help "catch" displaced snow that would otherwise land in your driveway.
- Please, note that clearing the snow to the left of your driveway will not keep all of the snow out of your driveway, but it will greatly reduce the amount that you will have to "re-shovel."
