
ELECTION DAY

PARK RULES & REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations are set forth for the use of the parks and open space in the Township of Upper Pottsgrove:

- **Firearms**
 - 1) Using firearms or other weapons, including, but not limited to, handguns, rifles, air rifles, spring guns, bow and arrows, slingshots, paintball guns, BB guns or rifles, darts or any other missiles or projectiles, unless a special permit has been acquired for Township-initiated animal control activities, is prohibited. Hunting, shooting, paintball and trapping are also prohibited.
- **Animals**
 - 1) Releasing or abandoning wild and/or domestic animals in a park or open space is prohibited.
 - 2) All animals are prohibited on sports fields whether or not on a leash or other means of control.

STORMWATER ~ WINTER

Seasonal Tips for Protecting Our Waterways in Winter By Emma Danz, Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy

Winter is certainly here, and with it comes road salts, piles of snow and uninvited house guests (the furry kind). Why not do your part this winter season to protect our streams from unnecessary stormwater pollution? Following these tips can help keep our water clean and protect the environment:

- Dispose of shoveled snow in vegetated areas; never dump it into streets or streams.
- Use safe and effective alternatives to salt for ice, and follow the application rate on the label. For more information, click here or type in <http://goo.gl/B3MkAy>.
- Use natural and non-toxic alternatives to chemical pesticides, and reduce indoor and outdoor chemical use. For more information, visit the Natural Resources Defense Council at <http://goo.gl/dvmB94>.
- Salt piles should always be stored under a roof. Report uncovered salt piles to the Department of Environmental Protection at 484-250-5900.
- Have a safe and happy winter, and thank you for keeping the health of the watershed in mind. Your efforts can make a difference! - 3) No animal shall be brought into a park or open space unless it is accompanied by and under reasonable control of a handler and firmly secured by means of a collar and leash or other device so it cannot stray beyond the control of the handler.
- 4) The handler of any animal shall immediately remove and dispose of any feces deposited by the animal in a sanitary manner.
- 5) Feeding, annoying, striking, injuring, maiming or killing any animals or birds, including the destruction of or interference with their nests, resting or breeding places are prohibited.

Tax Amnesty Program: April 21, 2017 – June 19, 2017

Under Act 84 of 2016, signed into law July 13, 2016, Pennsylvania authorized a tax amnesty period from April 21, 2017 through June 19, 2017.

During this limited 60-day period, the Department of Revenue will waive all penalties and half of the interest on eligible tax delinquencies for anyone who participates in the 2017 Tax Amnesty Program.

Locating Lost Insurance Policies for Loved Ones

Uncollected payouts from lost life insurance policies are not rare according to the Pennsylvania Department of Insurance (PID).

Beneficiaries, and those who have reason to believe they may have been designated a beneficiary, can begin by filing a free request with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC), triggering the NAIC, PID, and life insurance companies to search their databases.

Within 90 days, the requester should be notified if a policy exists and whether he or she is a beneficiary or entitled to information about the life insurance policy. You may contact the Pennsylvania Insurance Department's Consumer Services Bureau for further assistance at 1-877-881-6388 or go online at

FISHING RODEO

The Open Space and Recreation Board will hold a fishing rodeo on Saturday, June 17, 2017 from 8 a.m. to noon at Sure Catch Pond located in Sunset Park, 1401 N. Charlotte St., Pottstown, PA. It is free and open to township residents 13 years of age and under. Participants must pre-register at the township building at 1409 Farmington Ave. Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. A prize will be awarded for the largest fish and there will be giveaways for all participants. BYOB (Bring Your Own Bait) and fishing equipment! No previous fishing experience necessary. Sixteen year-olds and over must have a valid fishing license.

PREVENTING TICK BITES

Pennsylvania will once again lead the nation this year in Lyme disease cases, according to the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention. To prevent tick bites:

- Avoid wooded and brushy areas with high grass and leaf litter.
- Walk in the center of trails.
- Use insect repellents that contain 20 percent to 30 percent DEET on exposed skin and clothing for protection that lasts up to several hours. Always follow product instructions. Parents should apply this product to their children, avoiding the hands, eyes and mouth.
- Treat clothing and gear such as boots, pants, socks and tents with products containing 0.5 percent permethrin. Its protection lasts through several washings. Pre-treated clothing is available and may be protective for longer periods.
- Check your body for ticks after spending time outdoors.

LOST PET SIGNS


If you post signs because you have lost a pet, please take them down after 7 to 10 days' time has elapsed.

Regulation 301-11.F.(3)

No person, company, or entity shall fail to adequately maintain in good operating order any drainage facility on his premises. All watercourses, **drainage ditches**, culverts, drainpipes and drainage structures shall be kept open and free flowing at all times.
