A meeting of the Open Space Park and Recreation Board was held on Tuesday, March 2, 2021. Those present were Greg Churach, Chuck Note, Dennis Elliott, and Sherry Paup. Also present were Sherri Griffith & Township Manager Michelle Reddick. Commissioners Renee Spaide and Cathy Paretti were also present in the audience.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE – Those assembled pledged allegiance to the flag.

PUBLIC COMMENT – None.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> – Motion by C. Note, second by S. Paup, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes for February 10, 2021, with changes to add the Board members thanking D. Elliott for his many years of service as chairman. All ayes.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>KUMMERER PHASE 2A PRESENTATION</u> – G. Churach presented a table to use as a reference which was compiled from LTL's first review letter relevant to comments related to open space:

- #1 Not required to do landscape plans at preliminary stage ~ will do so at final plan stage
- #2 Will include all required buffers on landscape plans
- #3 No trails ~ softening buffers & fencing will be provided where necessary.
- #4 Alternate access feedback ~ Less or no steep slope impact
- #5 Wetlands certificate completed ~ Letter will be updated.
- #6 A waiver is required for landscape preservation ~ planting additional trees on small lots will be difficult.
- #7 Will show street trees on landscape.
- #8 Existing vegetation provides buffer
- #9 Section 310-38.3 (1) ~ Township must perform an appraisal and then, once information is received, a decision can be made.
- #10 Will comply with riparian corridor requirements
- #11 A significant number of trails being provided in Phase 1; will provide connection to Phase 2 & sidewalks will be provided in Phase 2. There is no area where a trail makes sense in Phase 2 as it would abut existing properties.

#12 No timeline showed for trail construction

- G. Churach presented a list to use as a reference which was compiled from LTL's first review letter relevant to comments not specific to open space:
 - #1 Provide streetlights will add to plans. G. Churach recommends LED. C. Note asked for a concrete timeline for the landscape.
 - #2 Relative to maintaining the Kummerer Road connection to Farmington Avenue to keep traffic on Pineford and Evans Road to a minimum, two alternative road layout plans for review were provided.
 - #3 Provide compliance with open space recommendations per MCPC review letter B. Erixxon needs feedback on the road network.

The Kummerer Phase 2A applicant agreed to return to present revised plans.

D Elliott asked how close to existing properties on Evans Road will Phase 2A be. The answer is 175 feet.

C. Note asked if wetlands could be allowed to be incorporated on the lot. B. Erixxon said they will be 25 feet away.

REPORTS:

GREEN ALLIES – K. Hamilton provided members with a copy of the report below.

Update:

- 1. Publicly want to thank Upper Pottsgrove for chipping the 240 Christmas trees that were collected this past January. The chips will be used directly on our trails.
- 2. We had 3 dangerous Ash Trees removed from the property last week. One behind our pavilion and two along the trails near the meadow. Total cost \$4,550 (2 on township property)
- 3. We have begun work on repairing "Old Grande Road Trail" which leads from the parking area to Sprogel's Run Trail. (Township Property) This is a very popular trail that is continuously washed out after heavy rains and has required repair for a couple of years. I received a Schuylkill Highlands grant to help with the cost. Repairs include digging a trench to direct runoff, the addition of pipe under Sprogel's Run trail to drain water away and repairing of the damaged trail. The goal is to have all the work done by April. Total cost approximately \$4,000.

- 4. Our Outdoor Summer Nature Camp Program was released to the public on February 4th and all 9 weeks completely sold out in under 2 weeks. We have no more open camp spots.
- 5. Analytics shows that we had over 1,200 Facebook engagements in February and our favorite community comment: Green Allies is a local non-profit that manages the Althouse Arboretum that saved our family's sanity all through this pandemic year. It is a little bit of preserved space in our community, student-run and by volunteers too. We are so extremely grateful for this local gem to our community!

Coming Up:

- 1. We will be hosting our traditional "Family Forest Easter Egg Hunt" (with COVID-19 adaptations) on March 27th from 10 am to 2 pm. Families need to register for a time slot. Includes a hike in the woods to look for eggs. Prizes and games when they come out of the woods. A \$5 minimum donation per family is requested. Families can register on our website althousearboretum.org. Can a link be placed on the Township site?
- 2. Electronics/Appliance/Metal Recycling is scheduled for April 10th• It will take place at Pottsgrove Middle School to provide more space. We are adding a paper shredding station as well. Paper shredding has been the number one request from residents, so we decided to include it with this year's program. (This may be sponsored by State Representative Tracy Pennycuick. We are currently trying to work out details with her office)

DCNR C2P2 Spring Grant Round -Projects for submission include: Borough's Memorial Park Bridge & Streambank Stabilization Project; Amendment to Gerald Richards Parkin LPT.
